A Christmas Letter from Bishop Itty

My Dear Friends in Christ,

As we celebrate the mystery of the Incarnation during this holy season of Christmas, it is important to remember that the message of God's angels have always offered words of hope and consolation and promise to the faithful. In this regard, I invite you to consider the words of the angel Gabriel to Mary, at a time of personal stress, fear, and anxiety:



"... The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be barren is in her sixth month. For nothing is impossible with God." (Luke 1:35-37).
