Christa Rakich, Organist

Concert and recording artist Christa Rakich is chair of the Organ Department at New England Conservatory in Boston. A double major in Organ and German at Oberlin College, she later was a Fulbright Scholar with Anton Heiller in Vienna, Austria for two years.

Her many recordings include Bach's *Clavierübung*, and *Deferred Voices: Organ Music by Women Composers*.



While imprisoned for defiance against his patron, the Duke of Weimar; Bach set about composing a set of chorale preludes that would cover the liturgical year. The title page reads: "*wherein instruction is given to a student-organist to work out a chorale in every style, also to perfect oneself in the study of the Pedal; for the Glory of the Most High God and the Instruction of my Neighbor.*"

This is a two-hour concert with a mini-beer and hors d'œuvres intermission, plus a full Oktoberfest reception following the concert.
